Extended Learning Update: Mrs. Cathy Haller Superintendent Schultz introduced Mrs. Haller to the Board and thanked her for coming and discussing the Summer Extended Learning Program

information with the Board.

Motion Second Aye No	x	××	x	x	x x	<ul> <li>Mrs. Haller reported receiving an \$800,000 grant to be used for the 2010-2011 Summer Extended Learning classes. The grant specifies Title I schools are the only schools eligible for use of these grant dollars. There are seven Title I schools that meet the qualifications. Mrs. Haller reported services will be provided to 600 students. This grant provides behavior support at every school, with the exception of DIA. The literacy and math ratio is five to one, four days a week, eight hours a day for six weeks.</li> <li>There will be approximately 100 staff members hired to work with Summer Extended Learning. The Highly Qualified Teacher selection process will be used to hire certified staff. The program dates will be June 13 through July 21.</li> <li>The Board discussed the need for supporting all students for Summer Extended Learning; however, budget constraints prevent this from happening. #### Resolution For Extension of Deadline to file Charter School Application Regarding the Glade Park School

Board of Education Resolution: 10/11: 100 Adopted: May 3, 2011

WHEREAS, the District opened and operated a unique rural school known as the Glade Park School (GPS) at a temporary facility commencing in the fall of the 2009-2010 school year; and

WHEREAS, the Board, at its meeting on April 19, 2011, determined to close the school at the end of the 2010-2011 school year for budgetary reasons; and

WHEREAS, the Board is advised that a group of GPS parents and supporters desire to file an application setting forth a proposal to re-open and operate GPS as a charter school beginning in the fall of 2011; and

WHEREAS, the last date for filing a charter school application with the Board under Board Policy LBD for a charter school to begin operations at the beginning of the 2011-2012 school year was August 15, 2010 unless such application was first filed with the District Accountability Committee by August 1, 2010, in which case the last date for filing with the Board was October 1, 2010;

WHEREAS, section 22-30.5-107(2.5), C.R.S., allows the parties to waive the statutory October 1 deadline; and

WHEREAS, given that GPS parents and supporters did not have notice of the closure of GPS until recently, and because of the unique question presented of whether GPS might be viable if operated as a charter school, the Board deems it to be in the best interest of the District to exercise its option under such statute and Board policy BGF to waive and extend the deadlines for filing a charter school application under the Act and Board policy LBD on a one-time basis in order to consider an application regarding GPS on an expedited basis;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby agrees to waive and suspend the requirement that a charter school application must be filed by the deadlines set forth above in order to begin operation at the commencement of the 2011-2012 academic year, but such waiver and suspension shall apply only with respect to an application for the continuation of GPS as a charter school to open in the fall of 2011, and only if an application meeting the requirements set forth in the Act and Regulation LBD-R is submitted to the Superintendent on or before May 24, 2011.
