I. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I-1. Audit Report

- Mrs. Melanie Trujillo, Chief Financial Officer, Ms. Ashley Zhang, Accounting Supervisory, and Jim Hinkle, External Auditor, came forward to present the annual external audit.
 - The ACFR – Annual Comprehensive Financial Report was reviewed.
 - Ms. Zhang described the audit process from the planning to finalization, and then filing. There will be a post-audit process with a January 2024 review.
 - Mr. Hinkle, external auditor, discussed the audit process, highlights and findings. He spoke about the segregation of duties, internal controls, and processes. The process is looking for significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. There were none found. There were no non-compliance issues or findings with respect to federal programs and there was open transparency throughout the process. The report is in draft form now and will be out by the end of the month. It will be posted under Financial Transparency on the school website.
 - The Board described and confirmed the audit process and how the auditor comes into the office to work with and observe the Financial department.

J. AUDIENCE COMMENTS

- Stephanie LaCount, Fruita 81521
 Ms. LaCount stated Fruita 8/9 staff had consolidated their voices as one through her. She acknowledged the Fruita 8/9 situation is difficult and staff understood. There are no easy answers so this must be student focused. They acknowledge the need for change with best interests of students in mind. The only way is to engage and empower students. They cannot argue with the issues. She stated we are a united school district. She stated the talents, dedication and knowledge from both campuses should be addressed. Each position should be posted for the best candidate for each position. Our kids deserve nothing less than the best version of Fruita.
- Tracy Seremak, Grand Junction 81504
 Ms. Seremak is a Math teacher in the District and stated teachers make over a thousand decisions each day. Complex decisions to close schools and do that within laws and guidelines should have teachers at the table to help make these decisions. She heard someone said the district does not want to make the same mistakes as with East Middle School. There is collaboration in D51 and we should work together for displaced teachers and maintain compliance. Openings will likely be many as a historical trend and we are all employees of D51. There are severe teacher shortages and we should work together for the best decisions.

- Dan Worth, Grand Junction 81507
 He is a 5th grade teacher at Scenic Elementary. Scenic was told in 2011 that their school would close. They didn't close but were later faced with consolidation. He explained mutual consent law is connected to MVEA and the schools and state. He read part of the law. He stated the key point in the law was that in making decision, the district shall work with MVEA association to work together for a policy to follow. The policy should be collaborated on. Other parts of the state are doing this. He encouraged the district to start a committee to follow suit.
- Carrie Thornton, Grand Junction 81501
 She wanted to clarify they are not asking the District to not consolidate the schools. She requested we amend the resolution to give options to staff. Other language than mutual consent law was mentioned. If we collaborate, we can demonstrate staff and teachers are valued along with all other goals. We should explore other options such as consolidated staff, then use procedures for overstaffed schools. Offer early retirement and look at reserve funds. This would provide a softer landing coming out of a pandemic. Other models should be examined.
- Colton Berry, Fruita,81521
 Mr. Berry is a FMHS Science teacher and representative of MVEA. He asked: Are we supporting staff? Says teachers felt ignored, hurt and felt lack of support. In 2022/23, DPS closed three schools. An MOU made by DPS and the teachers association was modeled to better support teachers during a consolidation. He wants to know why a MOU will not work in this situation.
- Ricki Howie, Grand Junction
 Ms. Howie was at the meeting last week and wants to know why Board is not closing Gateway Schools with only ten students last year and fourteen students this year. Bussing is being done from Glade Park. She believes we should look at the path of closing Gateway.
- Mary Orzechowski, Grand Junction 81501
 With closing Fruita and consolidation, will that get us through funding gaps and are we planning on closing more schools in near future? What is cost of maintaining East Middle School? Is there a plan for the building and when will that information be made available? She just noticed a KKCO article stating additional funding was available. She wants to know more about that.
- Vera Molder, Grand Junction 81501
 Being a former teacher and retired from D51, she resents money going to private schools. Charter schools opened after East Middle School closed. She wanted to know why BOE members' children attend private schools and are home schooled. Does not like BOE members telling us how to educate our students when theirs are not there.
- Kraig Meyer, Grand Junction 81507
 Mr. Meyer is a parent standing in as the band parent organization. Touted band program at Fruita. Spoke positively about Mr. Crabtree and another new teacher who are both wonderful. He stated the area is blessed with good teachers from the area. The band is greatly supported and Mr. Crabtree and Mr. Hannig are the glue that hold this band program together.

and Dissolve the Fruita 8/9 School**

Board of Education Resolution 23/24: 44

Adopted: December 19, 2023

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2023, the Board of Education adopted Resolution 22/23: 71, directing the Superintendent to begin working with District staff to make the recommended and necessary changes needed to transition the secondary schools in the Fruita area to a traditional grade configuration with students in grades sixth through eighth being educated through a traditional middle school, and students in grades ninth through twelfth being educated through a traditional high school; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education adopted Resolution 22/23: 109 on May 5, 2023, and Resolution 23/24: 30 on November 14, 2023, to make the necessary boundary changes to transition the secondary schools; and

WHEREAS, the above boundary changes along with implementation of other changes will allow for the reconfiguration of middle school and high school grades in the Fruita area to a traditional grade configuration; and

WHEREAS, implementation of these changes and reconfiguration to a traditional grade configuration means it is in the District's best interest to close the Fruita 8/9 School;

WHEREAS, the Fruita 8/9 building located at 1835 J Road, Fruita, Colorado will no longer house the Fruita 8/9 school but can adequately accommodate the Fruita Middle School students in grades of sixth through eighth; and

WHEREAS, the current Fruita Middle School building at 239 North Maple Street, Fruita Colorado will no longer be needed to house middle school students as of the 2024-2025 school year; and

WHEREAS, additional temporary classroom space will be added to the Fruita Monument High School campus located at 1102 Wildcat, Fruita, Colorado to adequately serve high school students in grades ninth through twelfth beginning with the 2024-2025 school year; and

WHEREAS, the closure of Fruita 8/9 School will displace thirty-six non-probationary teachers/counselors/administrators; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education hereby wishes to close the Fruita 8/9 School as a school within Mesa County School District 51 beginning with the 2024-2025 school year; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education hereby wishes to change the location of the Fruita Middle School to 1835 J Road, Fruita, Colorado beginning with the 2024-2025 school year and to reconfigure the Fruita area to a traditional grade configuration educating grades sixth through eighth at the new Fruita Middle School location and grades ninth through twelfth at the current Fruita Monument High School.

The District is committed to a learning and working environment that is free from sexual harassment. Sexual harassment is recognized as a form of sex discrimination and thus a violation of the laws which prohibit sex discrimination.

It shall be a violation of policy for any member of the district staff to harass another staff member or student through conduct or communications of a sexual nature. Any conduct or communication of a sexual nature directed toward students by teachers or others to whom this policy applies, shall be presumed to be unwelcome. Sexual harassment committed by an employee of the District in the course of employment shall be deemed a breach of duty, and as such, shall subject the offending employee to disciplinary action. This policy similarly applies to non-employee volunteers or any other persons who work subject to the control of school authorities.

Sexual Harassment Prohibited

For the purposes of this policy, unwelcome sexual advances or requests for sexual favors, or otherwise unwelcome physical or verbal conduct or communication of a sexual nature constitutes sexual harassment if, under the totality of the circumstances:

1. Submission to the conduct is made either an explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of a person's employment or educational development.
2. Submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as a basis for employment or educational decisions affecting such individual.
3. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work or educational performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working or educational environment.

The prohibition against sexual harassment applies whether the harassment is between people of the same or different gender.

Sexual harassment as defined above may include but is not limited to:

1. Sex-oriented verbal "kidding", abuse or harassment.
2. Pressure for sexual activity.
3. Repeated remarks to a person with sexual implications.
4. Unwelcome touching, such as patting, pinching, or constant brushing against another's body.
5. Suggesting or demanding sexual involvement, accompanied by implied or explicit threats concerning one's grades, employment status, or similar personal concerns.
6. Sexual violence

Reporting, Investigation, Sanctions and Discipline

It is the express desire of the Board to encourage victims of, or witnesses to, sexual harassment to report such claims through the District's complaint process. (See Regulation AC-R).

Employees who feel that their superiors are conditioning promotions, increases in wages, continuation of employment, or other terms or conditions of employment upon agreement to unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature, are encouraged to report these conditions to the appropriate administrator or to the District's Title IX compliance officer.

All reports of sexual harassment received by any District employee shall be promptly forwarded to the compliance officer. The compliance officer shall ensure that every complaint is promptly investigated and responded to as set forth in the District's complaint and compliance process. No reprisals or retaliation shall be allowed to occur as a

result of the good faith reporting of charges of sexual harassment or participation in an investigation. Requests for confidentiality shall be honored so long as doing so does not preclude the District from responding effectively to the harassment and preventing such conduct in the future.

Any employee found to have engaged in sexual harassment shall be subject to sanctions, including, but not limited to, warning or reprimand, suspension, or termination, subject to applicable procedural requirements. Conduct of a sexual nature directed toward students is strictly prohibited and shall, in appropriate circumstances, be reported as child abuse for investigation by appropriate authorities in conformity with policy JLF.

Notice of policy

Notice of this policy shall be circulated to all district schools and departments and incorporated in employee handbooks.

BOARD MEMBER COMPENSATION/EXPENSES/INSURANCE/LIABILITY

Adopted: October 10, 1972

The taxability and tax status of all compensation, expense reimbursement, and other payments that the District makes to, or on behalf of, the members of the Board of Education is determined by applicable state and federal law. Board members must follow the Board's policy or administratively established procedures for claiming and substantiating all amounts for which payment or reimbursement is requested.

Compensation

Board members will serve without compensation for their services unless compensation has been authorized by a written resolution adopted by a majority vote of the Board in a public meeting; except that no Board member may have their compensation increased during the term in office to which they have elected or appointed.

Any compensation provided to Board members must not exceed \$150 per day for not more than five (5) days of service per week, excluding federal and state holidays. Board members may only receive compensation for days when official Board duties – meaning Board meetings and other official activities and duties, including those that are conducted with a majority of the Board present, are performed.

Reimbursement

Upon submitting vouchers and supporting bills for expenses incurred in carrying out specific services previously authorized by the Board, Board members may be reimbursed from District funds in accordance with the Board's policy on expense authorization and reimbursement and in amounts approved by a majority vote of the Board in a public meeting.

Insurance and Liability

The Board will purchase liability insurance and errors-and-omissions insurance to protect its members individually and collectively for claims made against them as a result of their membership on the Board.

The Board will rely on the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, C.R.S. 24-10-101 et seq. (the Act) as the statement of its obligation to defend and indemnify Board members. If the Board elects to prove for the defense of a Board member in a claim which alleges willful and wanton conduct by the Board member, the Board may require the Board member to post a reasonable bond to ensure reimbursement of any amounts advanced, in accordance with the Act.
