- GEOMETRIC: Shapes made out of POINTS and LINES
- ORGANIC: Shapes that occur in NATURE
- FREE FORM: Shapes that are IRREGULAR and UNEVEN

Art \& Math Connection GEOMETRY is the study of shape, size, relative position of figures, and the properties of space. Artists use geometry to learn how to draw shapes and figures.

Step 1.
Use a pencil or pen to draw a variety of shapes that overlap each other.


Step 2.
Color in your shapes:

- You must color the entire picture so that no white parts show.
- Each shape section must have a different color.
- Two connecting shapes have to be different colors.

Step 3.
When you have finished coloring, go over your lines to make your shapes POP!



TRY THIS:

- Use only WARM or COOL colors to fill in the shapes or background.
- Draw only geometric, organic, or freeform shapes.

Look at your picture. Can you find the geometric shapes? What are they?
Can you think of a shape that is geometric, organic AND freeform?
